This workshop is an introductory session for adults interested in empowering children and young people with behaviours that enable them to recognise situations in which their personal space and sense of safety may be compromised.

Children are not responsible for 'protecting' themselves from harmful situations, however we can empower them to know what safety/safeness might look and feel like, provide them with strong language skills to ask for help if they need it, and to identify the safe people in their life.

These sessions are based on peer reviewed best practice, conducted in-line with BlueKnot Foundation trauma-informed principles, and embrace diversity and inclusiveness of all.

In order to maintain a safe learning environment, our workshops can facilitate a maximum of 50 and minimum of 10 participants.
